DELAC Topics	<ul> <li>Alison presents the link for the minutes from the last DELAC meeting and asks someone to approve the minutes from that meeting. Cynthia Martin proposes approval of the minutes. Susana Guerra seconds.</li> <li>Alison reviews EL reclassification, also known as RFEP. In order to reclassify, there are two components. The first one is a qualifying ELPAC score of 4 overall and the second component is a qualifying grade level Renstar reading score. Renstar is the district reading assessment, which students take three times a year. Students can get a 2 or 3 in a certain domain on the ELPAC, but they need a 4 overall in order to qualify for</li> </ul>			

	reclassification. Qualifying grade level Renstar reading scores are presented and reviewed along with a sample Renstar score report. Once those criteria have been met, parents are sent the first parent notification letter, which invites them to a meeting to discuss the progress of the student and whether they are recommended for reclassification. After the meeting, if stakeholders (teachers, EL coaches, parents/guardians, adult students) decide it is in the best interest of the student to be reclassified, then we send a final determination letter home. A sample of the letter is displayed. The date on the letter is when the student is officially RFEPed.  Other home notifications sent to EL students include the IA (initial language assessment) letter. Kristy Salinas states that the letter is sent to parents and guardians to inform them that the student must take the initial language assessment to determine English language proficiency levels. The ELPAC summative assessment letter is sent to parents/guardians each year to inform them that an EL student must take a yearly summative assessment of their English language skills. All parents/guardians need to be informed of this before the student is tested.  Family resources are shared and presented.
